Current Status

- The LMFD has an organized deployment model that provides on-duty staffing 24 hours a day / 365 days a year to respond to emergencies from each of our five fire stations.
- The District's Headquarters is located in the City of Lathrop's new River Islands Development at Fire Station 35.
- The authorized career personnel strength of the Fire District includes 44 uniformed employees and 4 office staff employees. A Volunteer/Reserve Firefighter roster of 35 members is maintained to offer hands-on training and augment our career fire suppression force.
