3. CITIZEN'S FORUM

Government Services Director and City Clerk Teresa Vargas announced public comment letters received for Citizen's Forum, submitted by Christina Campoy-Laughlin (Lathrop resident) expressing concern the recently adopted General Plan Update, potential warehouse and distribution centers near Lathrop High School, and provided electronic copies of paper and online signatures gathered to support her expressed concerns. John Thanh Do (Lathrop resident) expressing concern with potential warehouse and distribution centers near Lathrop High School.

Christina Campoy-Laughlin (in person speaker) expressed concern with the adopted General Plan Update, requested that the City Council open the matter for discussion at a future City Council Meeting; and expressed concern with a San Joaquin County referral to consider a Commercial Cannabis Business Park proposed near Lathrop city limits. Lawrence Abbott (zoom speaker) commented on prior environmental and wildlife projects, in which he participated in; requested a plaque for retention ponds within the city. Jack Varrella (zoom speaker) expressed concern with the adopted General Plan Update. Michelle Maddon (in person speaker) expressed concern with traffic safety and potential industrial projects near Lathrop High School. Anil Kumar (in person speaker) expressed concern with traffic safety in the Central Lathrop development area; expressed the need for additional school options to support the new development areas. Alicia Sandoval (in person speaker) expressed concern with potential warehouse and distribution centers near Lathrop High School. Arjka (zoom speaker) expressed the need for additional school options to support the new development areas; and expressed concern with speeding in Stanford Crossing. Bhimsen (zoom speaker) expressed the need for additional school options to support the new development areas and inability for Stanford Crossing residents to attend River Islands Charter Schools. Adriana Flores-Lopez (in person speaker) expressed concern with commercial truck traffic; requested an update on traffic enforcement of commercial vehicles on the residential portion of Lathrop Road; and requested a CHP enforcement operation. Jack Varella (zoom speaker – 2nd request to speak) expressed concern with navigation apps showing Lathrop Road as a commercial route.
