

2023 SJMSCP Development Fees Annual Adjustment

Background

- November 6, 2001 Lathrop City Council adopted Resolution No. 01-194 establishing the San Joaquin County Multi-Species Habitat Conservation and Open Space Plan (SJMSCP).
- The Plan allows project applicants to mitigate for impacts to covered species resulting from new development.
- Participation in the Plan fulfills ESA, CESA NEPA & CEQA requirements and provides a streamlined process saving time and money.

2023 Annual Fee Update


- The SJMSCP (Habitat) fees are adjusted annually.
- On August 25, 2022, SJCOG Board Inc. approved the annual adjustment to the Habitat fees.
- The final calculation of the 2023 fees shows an approx. <u>decrease of 1.6%</u> in the most commonly impacted categories of Agricultural and Natural habitat classifications compared to 2022.
- All participating cities and the County are required to adopt the annual adjustment of fees.

Multi-Purpose Open Space	\$9,781	\$9,629
Agriculture or Natural	\$19,561	\$19,255
Vernal Pool – grasslands	\$80,453	\$75,320
Vernal Pool – wetted	\$174,040	\$176,878
