Background



- ▶ November 6, 2001 – Lathrop City Council adopted Resolution No. 01-194 establishing the San Joaquin County Multi-Species Habitat Conservation and Open Space Plan (SJMSCP).
- ▶ The Plan allows project applicants to mitigate for impacts to covered species resulting from new development.
- ▶ Participation in the Plan fulfills ESA, CESA NEPA & CEQA requirements and provides a streamlined process saving time and money.

2023 Annual Fee Update



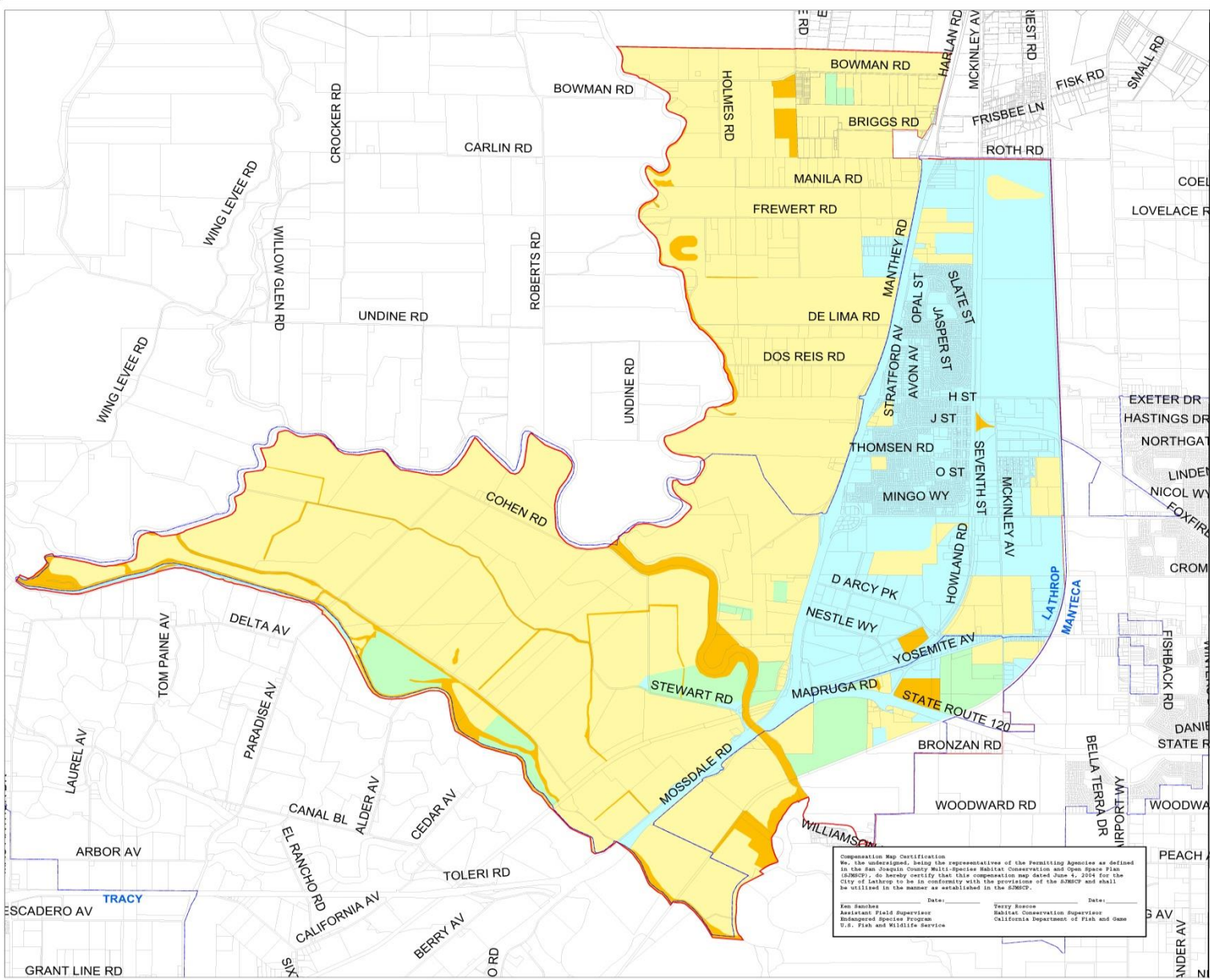
- ▶ The SJMSCP (Habitat) fees are adjusted annually.
- ▶ On August 25, 2022, SJCOG Board Inc. approved the annual adjustment to the Habitat fees.
- ▶ The final calculation of the 2023 fees shows an approx. decrease of 1.6% in the most commonly impacted categories of Agricultural and Natural habitat classifications compared to 2022.
- ▶ All participating cities and the County are required to adopt the annual adjustment of fees.

Habitat Type	Current Fee Per Acre	New Fee per Acre
Multi-Purpose Open Space	\$9,781	\$9,629
Agriculture or Natural	\$19,561	\$19,255
Vernal Pool – grasslands	\$80,453	\$75,320
Vernal Pool – wetted	\$174,040	\$176,878

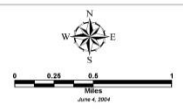

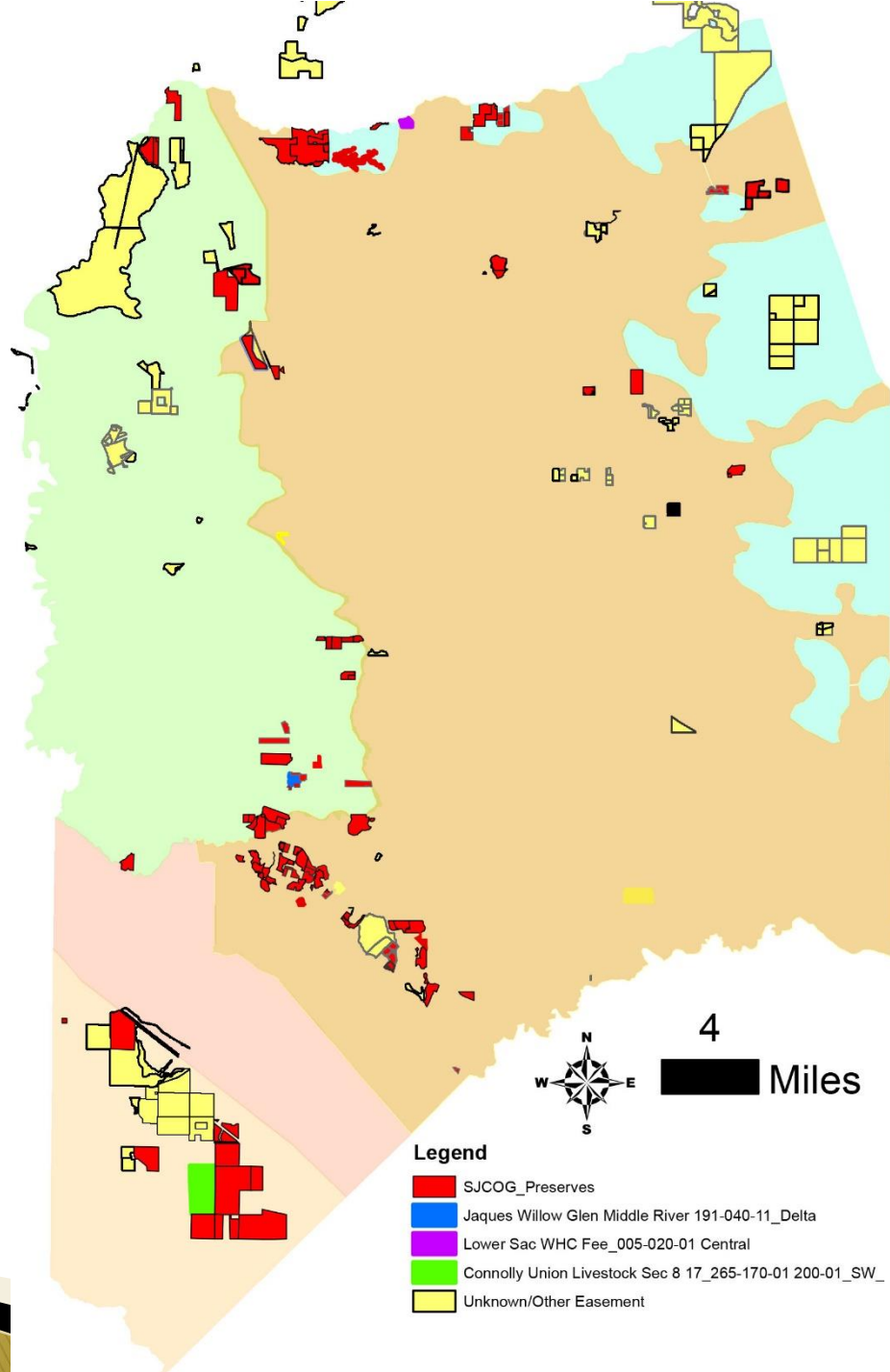
