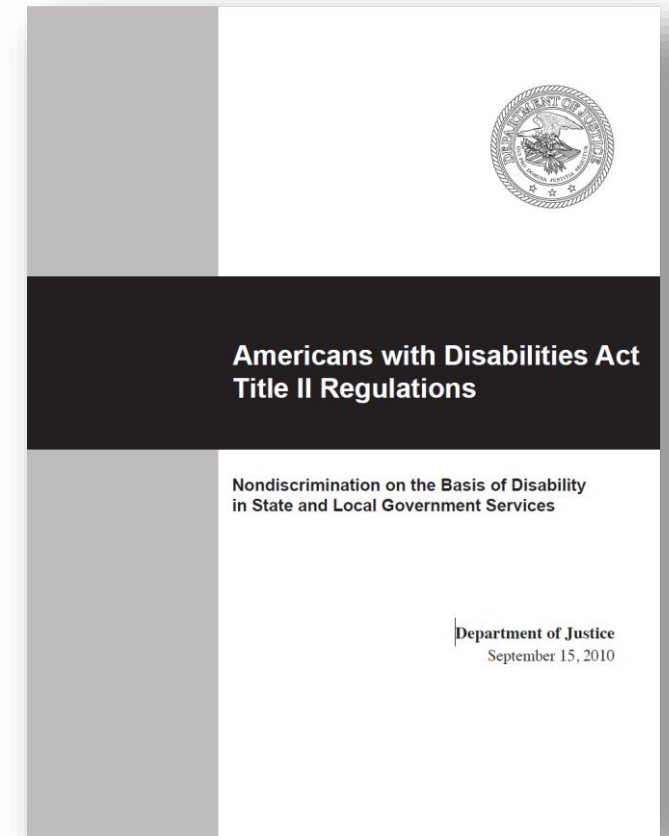

ADA TITLE II REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC ENTITIES

As a Public Entity The City of Lathrop is Required to:

- Produce an ADA **self-evaluation and transition plan** (SETP)
- Identify a **person to oversee** ADA Title II implementation
- Publish a **notice and grievance procedure** for accessibility complaints
- Continue to **remove accessibility barriers** and document progress
- Include **people with disabilities** in the preparation of the plan



ADA TITLE II REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC ENTITIES

Self-Evaluation (CFR §35.105)

- Evaluate services, policies, and practices
- Identify modifications

Transition Plan (CFR §35.150d)

- List barriers and identify solutions
- Establish a timeline for removing barriers
- Identify the person responsible for title II compliance

Engaging the Public (CFR §35.105 and §35.150d)

- Involve people with disabilities to participate in the self-evaluation process and preparation of the transition plan.

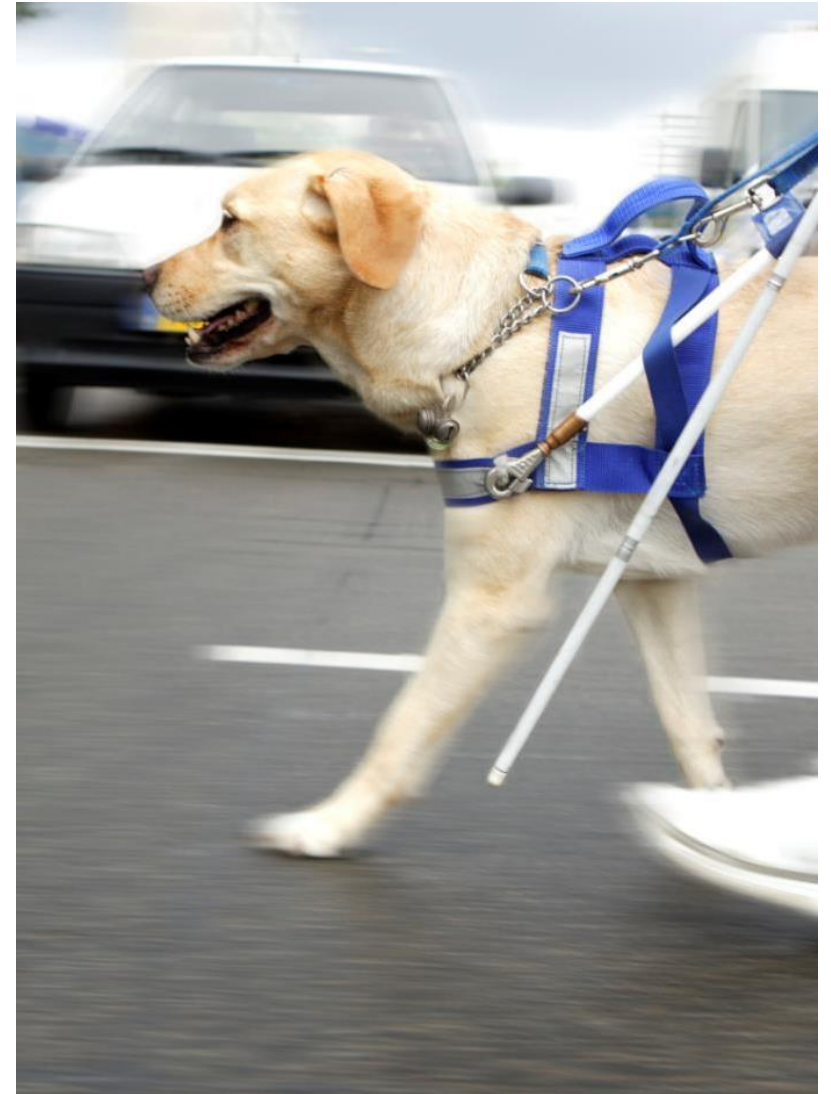

- Update codes and policies to use person-first language.
- Improve processes for effective communication.
- Provide training and resources for staff to improve consistency and confidence in:

ASSESS CITY FACILITIES

Most common park facility issues:

1. Walking path cross slopes / cracks / gaps
2. Missing or inadequate accessible picnic areas
3. Drinking fountains
4. Restrooms

Most common indoor facility issues:

1. Doors
2. Restrooms

Most common parking & exterior issues:

1. Signage
2. Striping
3. Detectable warnings





PRIORITIZE AND SCHEDULE

Prioritization Criteria:

- Level of use by the public
- Special user Groups
- Planned Obsolescence/Upcoming Projects
- Identified complaints or requests

Plan Structure:

- 10 years in 3-4 year increments
- Higher-priority facilities to be remediated sooner
